Hampshire County Councillor Update 10

Hello

Only a relatively short time between the last update and this, my tenth as Romsey Rural's County Councillor, inevitably so as it covers February.

Highways Information

Southampton Road, Romsey - roadworks

Thanks to a combination of hard work and better than expected weather the cycle path along Southampton Road in Romsey was completed in the middle of February two weeks ahead of schedule.

There have been some complaints about the amount of surface water along the carriageway itself, causing splashing of those using the cycle path at periods of heavy rain.

This part of the road has never had any drainage, other than the gullies at the southern end of the road which allow the water to drain into the ditch. The levels here are flat, but there is a slight drop which allows the water to drain towards the southern end. Given the lack of incline the slightest interruption to the flow of water can cause it to pool, we think this is what has happened with the road recently, because of the disturbance to the verge caused by the work and more importantly the damage to verge caused by traffic diverting around a fallen tree after Storm Eunice.

You may have noticed the verge is now repaired and we'll be monitoring any pooling of water along the road. If we find that it is still not draining quickly enough then HCC will look to install grips and additional gullies if necessary.

Works to address flooding on the M271/Romsey Road roundabout

There's been a fair bit of rain over the last few days and I am delighted to see that the drainage works, so far, seem to have worked and preventing the large puddles appearing by Romsey Golf Club.

I'll keep an eye on things to ensure that the problem remains solved.

Storms Eunice & Franklin



We were faced with considerable disruption this month as a result of Storm Eunice and then Storm Franklin. HCC Highways staff undertook a brilliant effort to keep routes open and clear any trees that did block our roads.

Over 12,000 incidents were reported during the storm and the clear up continues. Debris and timber that's lying along the roads will be cleared in the coming weeks, please bear with us while that happens.

It's been sad to see the damage at Sir Harold Hillier Arboretum and Gardens. Around 84 of their trees have been lost or badly damaged. The clean up job has been a big one and the gardens are likely to be affected for a while yet. Well done to the team for getting the gardens safely open once more within a couple of days of the storms.



Our local community has proven in the last couple of years that when faced with adversity we all pull together and the challenges Storm Eunice brought proved that once more. For example those who offered support to friends and neighbours left without power, the tree surgeons and farmers who worked tirelessly to clear roads of fallen trees quickly and TVBCs bin collection teams who completed their rounds on Friday in the most difficult of circumstances. Thanks to everyone who played their part.

Planning Applications - Nursling Recycling Centre and Paint Ball site, Lee Lane & Stanbridge Ranvilles Farm, Shootash

I've attended a number of Parish Council meetings recently where both of these applications have been discussed.

I am very concerned about both, most particularly the impact on residents of Lee, Upton and Station Road Nursling in respect of the former and the residents of Awbridge and Shootash in respect of the Stanbridge Ranvilles.

I'm meeting with planning officers to keep up to date with the progression of both and will update residents through social media channels and parish councils when I give my regular reports.



Secondary School Places – September 2022



More than 98% of parents in Hampshire have been offered a place for their child, at one of their three preferred choices for a secondary school in September 2022.

More than 92% have been offered a place at their first-choice school.

Applicants were informed of the outcome of

their application by letter or email on March 2nd.

Pupils who did not secure a place at one of their chosen schools have been allocated a place at their catchment school or the next nearest available school. Parents have the right to appeal in these situations and their child's name will be added to the waiting list for their preferred schools. Places do become available owing to parents changing their mind, or families moving home. In total we received 14,982 applications by the deadline this year – that's an increase of 499 applications compared to September 2021 (14,483).

Traffic Enforcement Consultation

HCC are consulting on enforcement of traffic restrictions at spots where there has been a proven problem.

One of these is local; the yellow hatched keep clear box outside the fire station on Alma Road in Romsey:

New measures to enforce traffic restrictions such as banned turns, yellow box markings at junctions and parking on school 'Keep Clear' markings – where they are frequently ignored – could be applied to some locations in Hampshire.

We want your views on 10 proposed sites before we apply to take on these new powers. They've been proposed due to their Personal Injury Accident record (i.e. the number of recorded collisions at a site that have resulted in an injury), historical reports of poor compliance of the traffic rules in the area, and the potential for traffic congestion and delays.
